STATE LOSES GREAT SUPPORTER OF HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS

Known simply as "The Dipper", Richard Blount passed away over the weekend suffering a heart attack. Dipper was one of the voices of the mountains and conducted a local radio show for many years on WSGS-Radio in Hazard. Blount was a fixture at the Boys' & Girls' State Tournaments, often conducting his radio show courtside during the Sweet 16. Visitation will be held Wednesday at Hazard Memorial Gym from 6-9 p.m., with the funeral scheduled for 10 a.m. on Thurs., Aug. 30.

LAWRENCE COUNTY'S WEST ON THE LOOSE

Lawrence County's Michael West became only the 10th player in state history to rush for 6,000-plus career yards over the weekend. West ran 23 times for 310 yards, six touchdowns and three conversions in a 52-34 win over Huntington Cabell-Midland (WV). West entered his senior year with 5,639 yards, ranking him 12th and now ranks 10th at 6,140. Derek Homer of Fort Knox holds the mark with 8,224 yards from 1993-96. Only four players have rushed for 7,000-plus career yards. Homer is the lone rusher with 8,000-plus yards in state history. Following is a breakdown of West's figures.

FOOTBALL NOTES FROM WEEK#2

Defending Class AAAA champion **Male** handed defending Class AAA champion Highlands its second consecutive loss in a 30-0 win. The game was suspended due to weather just prior to the second-half kickoff and then later ruled final. In one half, Male racked up 278 yards on offense while holding Highlands to a minus-19. Quarterback **Brandon Blackerby** completed 14 of 21 passes for 166 yards and three touchdowns. **Chris Barclay** ran 12 times for 78 yards and a touchdown. Barclay also had four receptions for 38 yards and a touchdown as Coach Redman's troupe improved to 2-0 on the young season.

Trigg County's Justin Martin ran 20 times for 224 yards and two touchdowns as the Wildcats beat Todd County Central, 54-14. The Cats had 440 yards rushing on 47 carries. After averaging 323 yards passing last year, the Cats showed they can run in amassing their largest rushing effort in six years. Trigg County was without the services of quarterback **Marcus Green**

and All-State receiver **Devron Wadlington**, both of which were sidelined with ankle sprains. For **Todd County Central**, **Dustin Lopez** returned a kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown – the longest ever allowed by Trigg County.

Kyle Cecil set a **Bethlehem** school record with a 29-yard field goal in last week's 31-0 win over Owen County.

Brian Brohm completed 12 of 16 passes for 150 yards and a touchdown as **Trinity (Louisville)** defeated North Hardin, 44-0. Brohm is the brother of ex-Trinity and University of Louisville stars Jeff and Greg Brohm. **Jimmy Murray** ran 11 times for 76 yards and a touchdown and had four receptions for 44 yards for the Rocks.

Eric Moore of **Holy Cross (Louisville)** ran 30 times for 215 yards and five touchdowns in helping the Cougars to a 56-8 win over Shawnee. Holy Cross racked up 358 yards on offense while holding Shawnee to just 143. The Cougars forced nine turnovers – six by interception.

Perennial football powers **Highlands** and **Mayfield** are slow out of the gate this season, both starting at 0-2. Highlands suffered a 33-12 season-opening loss to Henry Clay and then a 30-0 setback to Male in the St. Luke Champions Bowl over the weekend. Mayfield lost to Evansville Mater Dei (IN) 24-14 in its opener and dropped a 16-0 decision at the hands of Marshall County last week. It was the Marshals' first-ever win over the Mayfield program. The last time Highlands started the year 0-2 was in 1991 when its finished 7-4 and lost in the first round of the Class AAA playoffs. Mayfield has not lost more than two games just three times in the last 11 years (12-3 in 1993, 11-3 in 1994 and 9-4 in 1999). Since 1990, both schools rank among the state's most successful with Mayfield posting 133 wins (133-24, 84.7%) and Highlands 126 (126-25, 83.4%).
