Holmes gave Beechwood only its second home loss in its last 49 games with a 28-19 win. **Brandent Englemon** ran for 150 yards and three touchdowns in a game that was final after three quarters due to weather. The Tigers other home loss was to Newport Central Catholic (17-14) in the second round of the Class A playoffs last year.

Ballard Memorial's Letiz Arnold helped the Bombers improve to 4-0 after rushing 20 times for 260 yards and two touchdowns in a 40-13 win over Heath. **Lawrence Arnold** had two receptions for 66 yards and a touchdown and returned a punt 59 yards for a score.

In just two quarters of action, **Shane Howard** scored three touchdowns and booted five extra-point-attempts in helping **Evarts** to a 56-14 win over Hurley, VA. Howard also had 11 tackles on defense. Teammate **Josh Snelling** had three carries for 148 yards.

Stephen Columbia hauled in six receptions for 106 yards and a touchdown in helping **George Rogers Clark** to a 35-6 win over Montgomery County.

Kentucky Country Day's Matt Endy is having a strong start to the 2000 season. Endy, a junior, is averaging 148 yards rushing and 129 yards passing through three games. He ran four times for 167 yards and two touchdowns and completed eight of 12 pass attempts for 170 yards and a touchdown in KCD's 42-12 win over Beth Haven last week.

Mason County's Nathan Myrick ran 16 times for 128 yards and a touchdown (44-yards) in the Royals' 39-10 win over Lafayette. Myrick also recovered two fumbles, returning one 25 yards for a score.

Paul Dunbar kicker **Carson Kerr** tied the school record for PATs in a game with eight in the Bulldogs' 56-8 win over Clay County. Kerr has kicked 19 consecutive attempts on the year.

Pleasure Ridge Park improved to 4-0 on the year with a 21-4 win over Ryle. **Rufus Wilkins** helped the Panthers to the win, running 10 times for 178 yards and two touchdowns.

Warren Central defeated Bowling Green for the first time since 1993, 37-30 last weekend. The win snapped an eight-game losing skid to the Purples. Warren Central used a solid running game, earning 355 yards on 62 attempts. **Gabe Forrester** ran 25 times for 164 yards while **Desmond Harris** ran 22 times for 152 yards.

Corbin's Stephen Cook ran 20 times for 181 yards and three touchdowns in helping the Redhounds to a 28-14 win over Middlesboro.
