#### DANVILLE REPEATS AS CLASS A CHAMPION

Danville picked up the school's ninth State Football Championship and second consecutive Class A title with a 14-13 win over Newport Central Catholic last Friday before 5,721 fans at the Ky. Fair & Expo Center's Cardinal Stadium in Louisville.

Down 7-0, Newport Central Catholic had the ball fourth and three at the Danville 10-yard line and opted to go for the first down. Jeff Smith's pass to Jeff Hellmann fell incomplete and the Breds turned the ball over on downs. Danville then took the ball and marched down the field for a score, highlighted by Kelvin Turner's 57-yard scoring run to take a 14-0 lead.

NCC got on the board in the third quarter, thanks to a two-yard run by Steve Everson. In the fourth, the Breds put six on the board after a 7-yard touchdown pass by Jeff Smith to Kevin Smith to pull within 14-13. The PAT kick failed, but NCC had one last chance at Danville. The Breds got the ball back on their own 20-yard line with 2:28 to go in the game and marched down to the Danville 34 before Wesley Cloud picked off a Jeff Smith Pass with 1:04 left to seal the Danville win.

The win gave coach Sam Harp his sixth State Championship game coaching win, second only to Beechwood's Mike Yeagle who has seven.

#### **BARDSTOWN COMPLETES UNDEFEATED SEASON**

Bardstown, behind the play of quarterback John Wesley Monin, completed the year undefeated at 15-0 and garnered the school's first State Football Championship since 1981, with a 47-16 win before 6,150 fans in last Friday's Class AA State Championship in Louisville.

Monin completed 13 of 18 passes for 124 yards and two touchdowns for the Tigers. Jamie Cotton ran 14 times for 159 yards and three touchdowns as Bardstown jumped to a 35-0 halftime lead. Bardstown amassed 404 total offensive yards while holding Prestonsburg to just 199.

#### **BOYLE COUNTY WINS AGAIN**

Boyle County's jump from Class AA to AAA didn't slow down the Rebels as they finished their season a perfect 15-0 after a 49-14 win over Rockcastle County before 9,140 fans last Saturday. The win gave Boyle County its third consecutive undefeated season and ran its consecutive game winning streak to 45, second only to Trinity (Louisville)'s 50 from 1988-91.

Casey McCoy ran for two touchdown runs of one and two yards, Jacob Tamme caught a 10-yard pass from Jeff Duggins and David Jennings booted a 37-yard field goal as Boyle County raced to a 24-0 first-quarter lead en route to the win.

Both teams were tough on their opponents' ground game coming in and it showed as Rockcastle County amassed just 40 net yards rushing while Boyle County managed just 62. The Rebels gained 266 total passing yards to The Rock's 132.

Jeff Duggins led the Rebels' passing game connecting on 13 of 20 pass attempts for 189 yards and three touchdowns. Rockcastle County's Aaron Anderkin completed eight of 21 pass attempts for 132 yards and a touchdown.

Boyle County's defense was strong, picking off six interceptions in the game – each by a different defender.

#### TRINITY RETURNS TO TOP

After suffering a 34-14 loss to Male in last year's Class AAAA State Championship, Trinity returned to its rematch with the Bulldogs looking to stop a two-game losing skid in State Championship play. The Rocks snapped the losing skid and earned their 13<sup>th</sup> State Football Championship with a 45-19 win before the second-largest crowd for the Class AAAA Championship game with an attendance of 20, 485 last Saturday.

Male held close to the Rocks, trailing just 18-13 at the end of a back-and-forth long first quarter. Trinity put 20 points on the board over the next two periods, while holding Male scoreless in taking a 38-13 lead going into the final period. Male managed a touchdown, but Trinity answered to claim the 45-19 win.

Trinity quarterback Brian Brohm was impressive. Brohm completed 12 of 21 passes for 377 yards and three touchdowns. Male's Michael Bush, filling in for the injured Brandon Blackerby, gave a great effort by completing 19 of 36 pass attempts for 331 yards and a touchdown.

DeQuese May led Trinity on the ground with 22 rushing attempts for 144 yards and four touchdowns. Bush also led Male in rushing with 59 yards and a touchdown on 10 attempts.
