FB WEEK #1 NOTES

Chris Lofton of Mason County, MVP of last year's Boys' State Basketball Tournament, caught six passes for 254 yards and two touchdowns in a 48-6 win over defending Class AA State Champion Breathitt County in the Recreation Bowl in Mt. Sterling.

The state's longest winning streak of 24 games held by Trinity (Louisville) was snapped with a 17-13 loss to Nashville Montgomery Bell Academy (TN) over the weekend. Rocks quarterback Brian Brohm completed 34 of 53 for 448 yards and a touchdown. Brohm also had a streak of 10 consecutive games without an interception streak snapped in the contest.

Williamsburg's Andy Greer completed 27 of 33 passes for 417 yards and five touchdowns in a 64-32 win over Owen County. Greer connected with seven different receivers, including Tyler Ayers who caught 10 receptions for 188 yards and three touchdowns. For Owen County, Chase Clark booted a 52-yard field goal.

Mark Dunn of Harrodsburg ran 20 times for 342 yards and five touchdowns in a 34-7 win over Western Hills. Dunn scored on runs of 2, 11, 27, 49 and 98 yards. On defense, he was credited with 13 tackles and recovered one fumble.

John Moody of Christian Academy-Louisville ran nine times for 100 yards in a 39-14 win over North Oldham. Teammate Eric Carpenter completed seven of 11 passes for 135 yards and 5 touchdowns. Kellen Rollins caught four passes for 115 yards and three touchdowns for CAL.
