#### **FORCHT GROUP OF KENTUCKY/KENTUCKY NATIONAL INSURANCE/KHSAA REGIONAL SPORTSMANSHIP WINNERS**

The 2010 Forcht Group of Kentucky/Kentucky National Insurance/KHSAA Sportsmanship Recognition Banquet is set for Sunday, April 25, beginning at 5 p.m. at the KHSAA Office in Lexington. This marks the 14th year of the program recognizing outstanding sportsmanship.

KHSAA member schools each select one boy and one girl as the local school sportsmanship winner. School winners are then eligible to be selected as the regional winner. From the 32 regional winners, one boy and one girl will be selected as the state winner and receive a one-time \$3,000 scholarship courtesy of Forcht Group of Kentucky and Kentucky National Insurance. Selection criteria includes: grade-point-average; letters of recommendations; leadership roles/honors; response to case study essay; verification of no game disqualifications. Each regional winner receives a plaque, a mantle clock from the KHSAA Officials Division and a \$200 book scholarship courtesy of the Forcht Group of Kentucky and Kentucky National Insurance.
